

St. Thomas the Apostle Roman Catholic Church was designed by Thomas H. Poole and Sons and built at the beginning of the 20th century. In 2017, half of the church's nave was destroyed, and the stained-glass windows were removed. The two side altars were taken to St. Patrick's Cathedral, located on Fifth Avenue between West 50th and 51st Streets, and the high altar was broken up with a jackhammer into 2000 pieces. Today, the church is an event space called Harlem Parish.
